

## TOOLING AND MACHINING (TAM) ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

**Donor Information**: This scholarship was established in 1993 by the Rochester Tooling and Machining Institute, Inc. to encourage students to engage in the metal working industry.

**Purpose of Scholarship**: For students enrolled in metal working industry related curricula at accredited community, junior or technical post-secondary institutions.

Number and Size of Awards: Number and size of awards varies.

Allowed Use of Award: Expenses associated with higher education.

**Eligibility Criteria**: Student must be a Monroe Community College (MCC) student with satisfactory performance in the prerequisites for the chosen field corresponding to manufacturing.

**Application Process**: The application process is coordinated through Rochester Technology and Manufacturing Association, 2024 West Henrietta Rd., Suite 3-J, Rochester, NY 14623. Applications are online at <u>https://monroecc.academicworks.com/</u>. Call (585) 510-6557 for further details. Applications are due in October for the Fall semester, and in March for the Spring semester. Specific due dates are based on the current due dates posted on MCC's scholarship website each semester.

**Committee/Selection Process**: A committee comprised of two RTMA members and three MCC faculty member's reviews applications, selects scholarship recipients, and notifies the Community Foundation.

Award Announcement and Payment: Award letters are sent by RTMA to the students and payment is made from the Endowment and disbursed to the students' accounts.

**Renewability**: This award is not automatically renewable; <u>students may reapply each</u> <u>semester</u>.

**Other**: This award is not transferable. If for any reason the recipient does not attend classes for the semester in which s/he receives the award, or if the class or classes are cancelled, the RTMA must be notified, and the award returned. The recipient may reapply for future tuition assistance.
